


The Ash Wednesday & Lenten Phenomenon


Lenten Practices

When asked: "Do you do any of the following during Lent?"


Percentage responding "yes" to each of the questions. Asked by Generation.

	Pre-Vatican II (Ages 65 - 85)	Vatican II (Ages 45 - 65)	Post-Vatican II (Ages 30 - 45)	Millennials (Ages 18 - 30)
Do you <u>abstain from meat</u> on Fridays during Lent?	64%	59%	59%	61%
Do you <u>receive ashes</u> at Ash Wednesday services?	58%	40%	40%	50%
Do you give up anything during the Lenten season?	33%	34%	38%	46%
Do you <u>do anything positive</u> such as giving money to the needy or trying to be a	50%	45%	41%	40%
better person during Lent?	45%	24%	15%	17%
